0	E	USB	A a mouse that uses light emitting diodes to track hand movements relative to an underlying surface
1		Control key	B a key used for typing upper-case letters or symbols when it is pressed at the same time as another key
2		keyboard	C to place the cursor on an item on a screen and press the mouse button
3		type	D a part of the mouse that is pushed to select items on a computer screen
4		cordless mouse	E an acronym that stands for Universal Serial Bus
5		Alt key	F a panel of keys for entering data into a computer
6		laser mouse	G to enter data into a computer using the keyboard
7		diacritical mark	H a key that gives another key an alternative function when both keys are pressed at the same time
8		click	I a device on a mouse that allows the user to scroll
9		Caps Lock	J the standard layout for English-language keyboards, with Q, W, E, R, T, and Y as the first keys from left in the top row of letters
10		scrolling	K a mouse that uses laser light to track hand movement
11		Shift key	L a mechanical mouse, uses a rubber ball to track hand movements
12		button	M a key on the keyboard that is used for typing all capital letters when it is pressed
13		LED mouse	N a symbol that is added to a letter to denote a special pronunciation
14		function key	O a key that gives another key an alternative function when both keys are pressed at the same time
15		ball mouse	P a key which is given a a particular function by a piece of software
16		numeric keypad	Q an act of moving information in a certain direction across a computer screen for viewing
17		mouse	R it transmits information to a computer without using a cord or wire
18		QWERTY	S a small keypad, located on the right-hand side of a standard keyboard, that features digits 0-9
19		scroll wheel	T a device that can connect to a port in a computer using Universal Serial Bus technology
20		USB	U a device used to track hand movements and make selections on a computer screen
