There's also a dinner table with chairs for two people. There isn't a bath, but Etgar washes under a shower which is above the tiny toilet. Up the ladder, there is one small bed and a little desk with a light. There are some books on a shelf behind his bed. And that's it! There aren't real windows, only two holes in the wall. Etgar can see if it's light or dark outside. Etgar built this house because he wants people to think about housing problems. It was an art project. Now, he sometimes stays and works there. It's OK for one person for a short time, but for a family? No way! Would you like to live here?
