In the shadow of the Statue of Liberty in New York Harbour (*завань*) lies Ellis Island, one of the most important places in the history of the United States. It was a gateway (*ворота*) to this country for millions of immigrants, who came to a country to live there forever.

Between 1892 and 1954, more than 12 million people passed through Ellis Island. They hoped to find a new, improved (*лучшая*) life for themselves in the United States of America. Many immigrants left the countries where they were poor.

After they passed some medical tests on Ellis Island, immigrants were allowed into the United States. Ferryboats (*паромы*) took them into New York City, where many of them stayed to live. Many others travelled to other major cities such as Boston and Chicago.
