

ADJECTIVES ENDING IN -ED AND -ING

When we want to describe how I feel we use **-ED** and to talk about the cause of those feelings we use **-ING**.

Example: I'm bored because the movie is boring.
I'm devastated due to this devastating criticism

NOTE. Some “feeling” verbs have an **-ED** adjective but not the **-ING** form, such as:

VERB	I AM -ED!

Scare	Scared	Asustado	Scary	De miedo
