

## Compare and Contrast – understand the terms and vocabulary

**Compare** – means to note the similarity or dissimilarity between

**1. to point out as similar, liken**

Examples:

She compared the activity of ants to the behaviour of humans.

She became as white as a sheet.

He is like a mouse in school but a lion at home.

**2. to examine for similarity or differences:**

Examples:

Before buying compare the two bicycles.

Please do not compare me with my friend.

We are two very different people.

**Contrast** - difference between two objects, people, or places

Examples:

1. Owls are birds but bats are mammals.
2. Unlike humans, ants behave in an orderly manner!
3. He likes to drive. However, he is not a good driver.
4. Mammals give birth to live ones while birds lay eggs.

**Compare and contrast:** In general use, such as in writing a “compare/contrast”

**compare** means “find the similarities” and **contrast** means “find the differences.”


