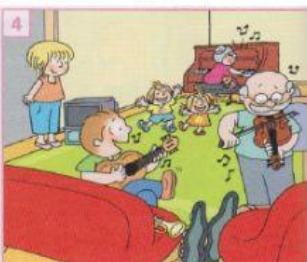

# Teen Gangs



Having friends is a vital part of growing up. When we belong to a group of friends, we share our ideas and experiences with them, forming our own personalities.

Problems begin when the need to belong to a group is so strong that people are prepared to break the law in order to be accepted by the group. Today, in many big cities more teenagers join gangs carrying out senseless acts of violence against other people. Why do young people break the law or use violence?
