

# HAVE GOT or HAVE??



**HAVE GOT** e **HAVE**: significado semelhante; ambos podem ser usados para falar de posse (possession), relacionamentos (relationships), doenças (illnesses) e características (characteristics) das pessoas ou coisas. Mas...

... **HAVE** é usado no registro mais formal e **HAVE GOT** no registro mais informal.  
Gramaticalmente:

☞ **HAVE**: precisamos de usar o verbo auxiliar (auxiliary verb) **DO** em frases negativas (negative sentences) ou em perguntas (questions);

☞ **HAVE GOT**: não usamos o verbo **DO**.



☞ They **haven't got** a car. (Informal)

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They **don't have** a car. (Formal)

☞ How many brothers **have** you **got**? (Informal)

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How many brothers **do** you **have**? (Formal)

## II- Expressões (collocations) com apenas o verbo **HAVE**:

- **have a baby...**
- **have + an illness (a headache...)/ have a surgery...**
- **have an appointment / interview**
- **have a conversation / talk ...**
- **have an argument / a fight**
- **have a party/ have a holiday**
- **have a good time/ have a blast...**

- **have + meal (lunch...)/ a drink (coffee...)**
- **have a shower...**
- **have + an activity (a swim/ jog...)**
- **have a haircut...**
- **have a break/ have a nap...**
- **have a dream**
