5 people speak English as a second or foreign language than as a first language!

Yet, English is a relatively new language. Did you know that when Julius Caesar landed in Britain over two thousand years ago English did not exist? Even at the end of the 16th century, only about six million people spoke English and all of these people lived in Britain itself. The English language was
10 not important to the rest of the world.

Then things changed. Around the year 1600. English speakers began to travel all over the world. They travelled with armies, navies, merchants and explorers. Of course, these people spoke their language wherever they went.

Today, about 350 million people speak English as a first language. There are
15 also about 400 million people who speak English although English is not their first language. This is true in places like India, where English is a second language, and Israel, where English is taught as a foreign language.
