

# SAFE CAMPING

Camping in the countryside is usually great fun, but sometimes things can (1) \_\_\_\_\_ wrong. Accidents can happen, (2) \_\_\_\_\_ it is essential to think about safety both before you go and while you are there. This will prevent your fun camping trip turning (3) \_\_\_\_\_ something less pleasant.

Firstly, you need to plan ahead. Check out the weather forecast a few days (4) \_\_\_\_\_ advance and watch out for any reports of fires in the area you are thinking (5) \_\_\_\_\_ going to. After meals, pick up any bits of food that (12) \_\_\_\_\_ be left on the ground, as these can attract insects - or larger creatures. It also makes sense for (13) \_\_\_\_\_ same reason, to keep unused food in closed containers well away from the camp. You don't want a hungry bear or other animal suddenly appearing in your tent!
