1625	Charles was presented with the Petition of Right a declaration of the "rights and liberties of the subject"
1629	Attempt to arrest five parliamentary leaders
1628	Charles escaped the Siege of Oxford and surrendered at Newark .
4 January 1642	Charles I succeeded his father .
1646	He dissolved Parliament again.
