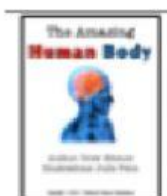

Bones and More Bones
The Skeletal System

The skeletal system is made up of all the bones in your body. It is also made of the things that connect your bones together: tendons, ligaments, and cartilage. The skeletal system also includes one set of hard objects that aren't bones: your teeth!



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Sk- the front of the leg bone that runs from the knee to the ankle.
Skin- the outer layer of tissue that covers the entire body.
Skid- the large structure of bones in the head.
Thigh- the part of the leg that runs from the knee to the hip.
Tooth- a hard body object in the jaw, used for chewing.

Central Nervous System

Brain - the part of the body that controls all functions in the body. It includes the cerebrum, cerebellum, and brain stem. It is the control center for the body, sending and receiving messages through the nerves.

Spinal Cord - the long, thin, tube-like structure that runs down the back, connecting the brain to the rest of the body. It is the main pathway for messages between the brain and the rest of the body.
