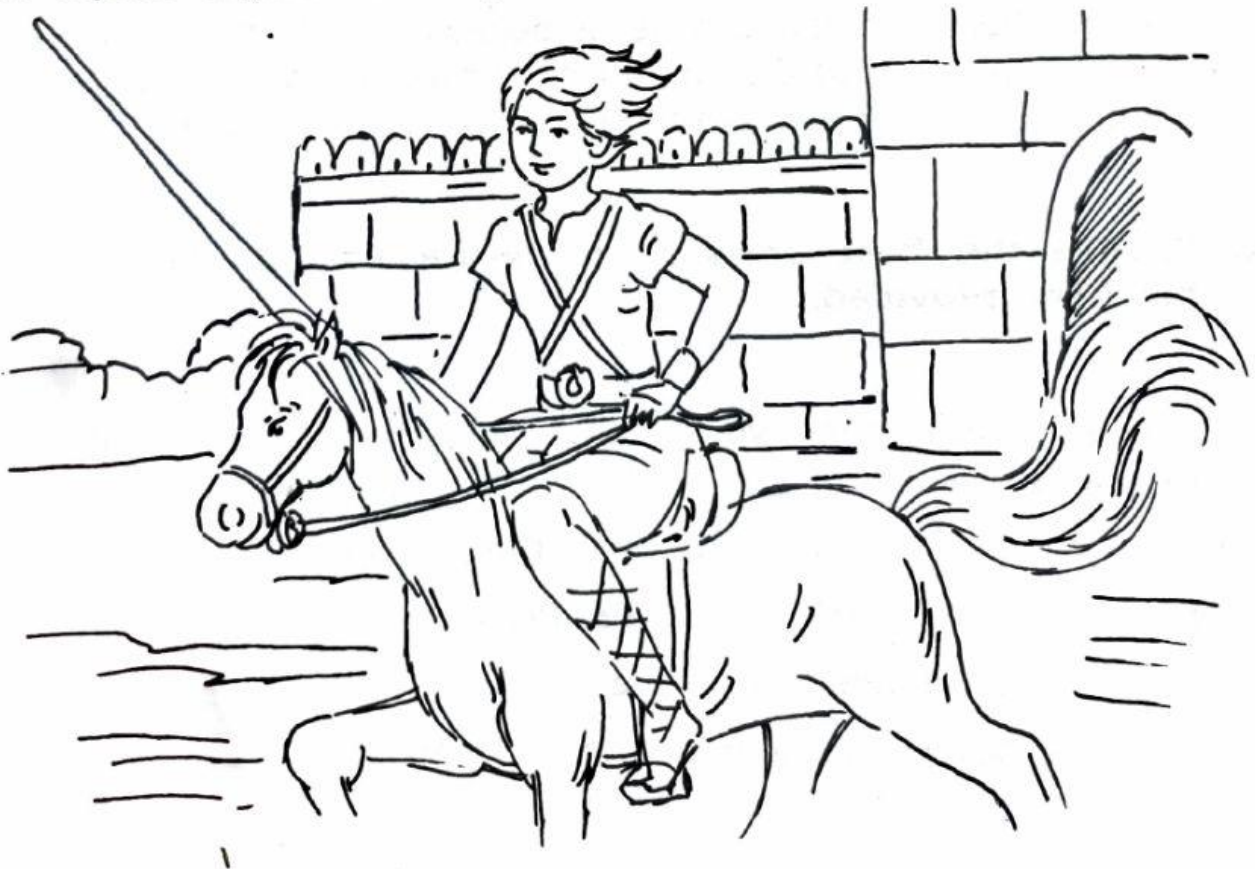


THE KNIGHTS OF THE OLDEN DAYS

In the Middle Ages, starting out to train to be a knight was a lot of fun. A young boy lived with his mother and other female members of his family. At this stage he had to learn to ride a pony and care for horses. At the age of 7, he became a *page* and had to leave home to live with a knight. At that young age he was taught to clean and handle weapons. It was at this time that he also had to learn the etiquette and behaviour that was expected of a knight.

At the age of 15 or 16 the young boy had to serve his master as a servant so that he could become a *squire*. He would, among other things, serve food and drink to his master. The squire's training also required him to ride into battle with his master and take part in the fight. This would usually take about five years and make the squire eligible for knighthood.





Any knight could grant knighthood to a young man. Sometimes the ceremony took place on the battlefield and it was a simple one. All it required the knight to do was to tap the back of the man to be knighted with a sword and say, "I dub you knight."

A knight had to follow a code of behaviour. He had to have a love for his religion, love the land of his birth and fight for it, protect women and the weak and never surrender to the enemy.
