

WRITING A NARRATIVE

It usually refers to the writer's experience.

It tells a story which may be made up. However, it must be believable to the reader.

Chronological order is essential.

Language will be semi-formal. Contractions are acceptable.

MIDDLE EVENTS Chronological order of events	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Just as I was talking to my best friend, ... • Just as I was leaving the room, something got my attention. • Immediately after cleaning it, the stain came back
END OF THE STORY	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • I looked up and saw Naomi. She was laughing too. • We were all impressed by the woman's solidarity. • The police arrested the man thanks to the evidence. • I had never been so.... in my life before.
CONCLUSION My present feelings and memories	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • I never really believed my grandpa until I saw my friends laughing. I still feel embarrassed for all that had happened. • It was the best summer ever; whenever I think of it, it is with a great smile! • Seeing the consequences, I'll never do that again. • A memory I'd love to keep forever. • Since that day, things have never been the same. • Fortunately, it all ended well. I spent two days in hospital and left without any trace of what had happened. But I haven't gone trekking any more!

WRITING A NARRATIVE: EXTRA TIPS

+ Use adverbs of manner and adjectives which describe feelings.

- Something really amazing happened to me
- That was an incredibly awful thing to do
- That was such an absolutely thrilling experience
- She sang amazingly
- Then he surprisingly said: '...'

+ Tenses.

- **Past simple:** It all started
- **Past continuous:** It was raining
- **Past perfect:** She had left me days before
- **Present simple:** to express your present memories or feelings
- **Present perfect:** to express how it all has influenced you.
- **Future:** to express how it will influence you in the future.

+ Use idioms.

- Every cloud has a silver lining
- On paper (= in theory)
- Best case scenario
