Present simple Am/is/are + past participle	Julie kisses the baby.	The baby is kissed (by Julie).
Past simple Was/were + past participle	Someone stole my bike.	My bike was stolen (by someone).
Present continuous am / is / are + being + past participle	She is cleaning the house.	The house is being cleaned (by her).
Past continuous was / were + being + past participle	Someone was stealing a bag.	A bag was being stolen (by someone).
Present perfect Have/has + been + past participle	The children have broken the glass.	The glass has been broken (by the children).
Past perfect Had + been + past participle	Someone had tidied the flat.	The flat had been tidied (by someone).
Future simple Will + be + past participle	She will fix the problems.	The problems will be fixed (by her).
Future with 'be going to' am/is/are + going + to + be + past participle	They are going to do the homework.	The homework is going to be done (by them).
Infinitive to + be + past participle	I need to clean the house.	The house needs to be cleaned.
