Bake for about 10 minutes or until the cookies are light brown at the edges.

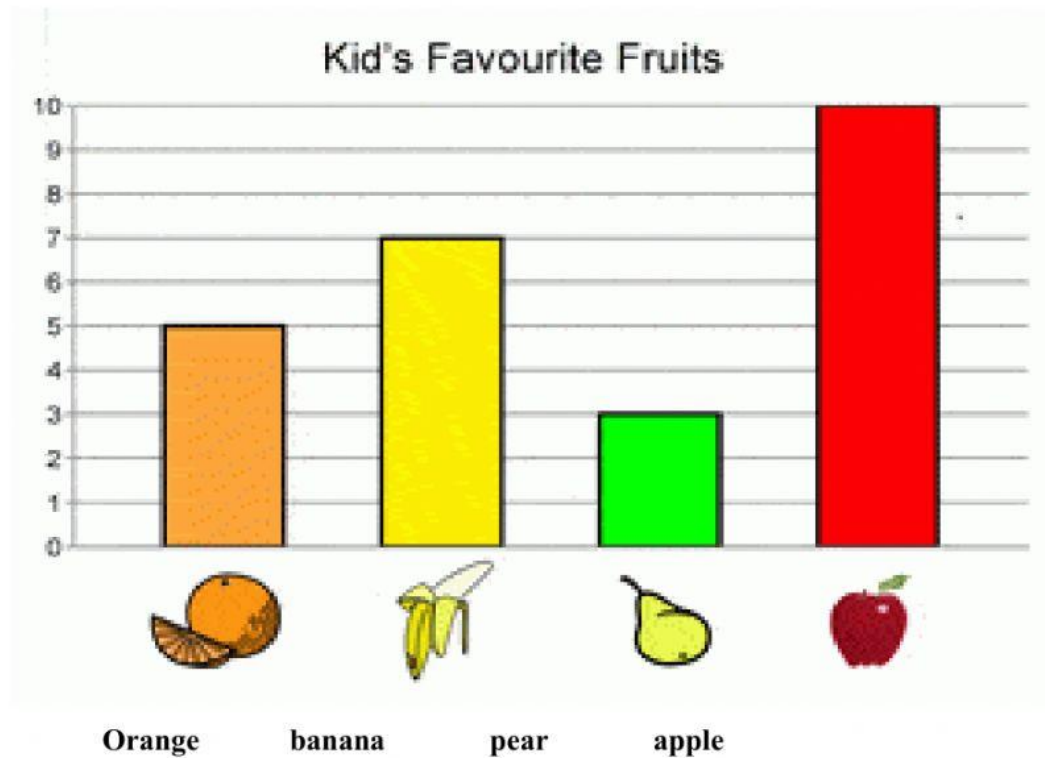
