Phrases with the present simple	Phrases with the present continuous
<ul style="list-style-type: none">• usually, always, sometimes, never• in the morning / in the afternoon / in the evening / at night• every morning / every afternoon / every night• every day / every week• every Tuesday morning / every Friday afternoon, etc.• on Mondays / on Wednesdays, etc.• at weekends• etc.	<ul style="list-style-type: none">• now• at the moment• today• etc.
