

Writing Clinic: Simple Sentences

A simple sentence consists of a **subject**, **verb**, **object** and/or **complement** (optional). Before starting to write paragraphs, stories or essays, it is important to get the basics right. Look at the examples, and then write some **simple sentences** yourself. Practise this as often as you can.

- I study English.
- We study English every day.
- My classmates and I study English every day at 1 PM.
- My classmates and I study English and Science every afternoon.
- My parents, my sister and I go on holiday once a year.
