- ❖ Bạn cần học thuộc lòng những câu hỏi đề nghị

Những dạng câu hỏi thường gặp

Q. Why don't you send some samples? Sao bạn không gửi vài hàng mẫu đi?
→ **That's a better idea.** Ý kiến đó hay hơn đấy.

Q. Would you like to go for a coffee break now? Bạn có muốn nghỉ uống chút cà phê bây giờ không?
→ **I'm sorry but I can't leave my office.** Thật tiếc là tôi không thể rời văn phòng được.

Q. Should we look over the procedures one more time?
Chúng ta có nên xem lại các thủ tục một lần nữa không?
→ **I'd be glad if you did that.** Tôi sẽ rất mừng nếu bạn làm vậy.

Q. Can you check my mail box? Bạn kiểm tra hộp thư điện tử dùm tôi được không?
→ **Okay, I will take care of it.** Được thôi, tôi sẽ để ý cho.

Thỉnh thoảng cũng sẽ xuất hiện đáp án bắt đầu bằng Because cho dạng câu hỏi này, bạn cần chú ý không chọn nhầm những đáp án đó. Đáp án sử dụng That's a good idea/That sounds good thể hiện sự đồng ý với câu hỏi đề nghị là dạng đáp án xuất hiện nhiều nhất. Bạn hãy ghi nhớ để có thể chọn ngay được đáp án đúng khi nghe thấy những biểu hiện đó. Đáp án (A) và (C) đều sử dụng các cặp từ có phát âm tương tự nhau project – projector, charge – charger để gây nhầm lẫn cho thí sinh nên là những đáp án không chính xác.
