- ☐ Did Atlantis exist? Or was it just a mysterious tale of a disappearing city?
- ☐ The Greek philosopher Plato wrote everything that we know about the mythical land of Atlantis. He lived from 427 to 348 B.C. (B.C. means before the time of Christ, when modern time began).
- ☐ Plato spent much of his life writing his *Dialogues*, essays on Greek life and myths and culture. In a Dialogue called *Timaeus*, he wrote about a mysterious continent called Atlantis. Plato claimed that Atlantis existed some 9,000 years before his own time. Many people who lived during Plato's era thought that he invented Atlantis as a way to talk about his theories of a perfect civilization.
- ☐ Strangely, although the ancient world did not believe in Atlantis, some people in the modern world do. Dr. Robert Ballard, who is famous for finding the ocean liner *Titanic* in 1985 on the bottom of the ocean, says the legend of Atlantis is "logical," as a volcano destroyed the island of Santorini near the coast of Greece 3,500 years ago. The dates don't match, but the story does. There are many theories about where Atlantis was—some even think it lies beneath the glaciers of Antarctica!
- ☐ But the last word belongs to Plato. The gods were not pleased that a once-perfect society had become evil. So, says Plato, the gods sent "one terrible night of fire and earthquakes" that caused Atlantis to sink into the sea. As every Greek legend and myth proves, it is never a good thing to anger the gods!
