



GRAMMAR IN CONTEXT *Will versus going to*

For decisions

We usually use **will/won't** when we make a decision at the moment of speaking.

We usually use **going to** when we have already made a decision for plans and intentions.

For predictions

We usually use **will/won't** to make predictions based on personal feelings or opinions.

We usually use **going to** when there is some evidence in the present to support the prediction.
