Edwin Land

Many people like to take photos. These days, people usually take photos with smartphones or digital* cameras, so they can see their photos right away. Before digital photos, people usually had to wait to see their pictures. They took pictures on film* and sent the film to a store. Then, someone developed* the film and printed the pictures on paper. This usually took a few days. But in those days, there was one way to get pictures much more quickly. People could use instant cameras.*

A scientist named Edwin Land made the first instant camera. Land was born in 1909 in Connecticut in the United States. When he was a child, he enjoyed playing with things like radios and clocks. Land liked to understand how things worked, so he studied science at Harvard University. In 1932, he started a company with George Wheelwright, and they called it Land-Wheelwright Laboratories. In 1937, the company name was changed to Polaroid.

One day, Land was on vacation with his family. He took a photo of his daughter. She asked him, "Why can't I see the photo now?" This gave him an idea. Land built an instant camera in 1947. It developed and printed photos in less than one minute.

Land's company made 60 instant cameras in 1948. The cameras were very popular, and they were sold out in one day. The company made more instant cameras, and customers all around the United States bought them. After that, people were able to see their pictures right away.
