Phrasal verbs with look

We can use *look* in many phrasal verbs. For example:

look into *look forward to* *look up from* *look out*

1 Sometimes the meaning of the phrasal verb can be easily inferred from the individual meaning of its parts.

look around somewhere—visit all different parts of a place

2 Sometimes the meaning of the phrasal verb is less clear from its parts.

look after something—make sure that something is safe
