## FIRST VS SECOND CONDITIONAL - OVERVIEW

## FIRST CONDITIONAL - USES

If + present  
A possible situation

Will/won't infinitive  
The consequence

-If you tell her the truth, she won't believe you

With comma

Without comma

-She won't be very pleased if you don't go

Instead  
will/won't  
infinitive

-If you miss the last taxi, {  
get a bus (imperative)  
you can get a bus (can + infinitive)}

## SECOND CONDITIONAL - USES

If + past (imaginary/  
hypothetical situation)

Would/wouldn't infinitive  
(the consequence)

-If I had a dog, I would do more exercise

With comma

Without comma

-I'd do more exercise if I had a dog

Instead  
would  
infinitive

-If I had a dog,

{ I could do more exercise

-If I/she/he/she/it.. was/were here, (both are correct) I would take the job

-If I were you, (always in this expression)
