<u>Can/can't</u>	She can <u>play the guitar</u>	So can I	I <u>can't swim</u>	<u>Neither can I</u>
<u>Past simple</u>	I <u>watched a movie last night</u>	So <u>did I</u>	I <u>didn't like the book</u>	<u>Neither did I</u>
<u>Would/wouldn't</u>	I <u>would like a cup of coffee</u>	So <u>would I</u>	I <u>wouldn't eat that</u>	<u>Neither would I</u>
<u>Present perfect</u>	They <u>have finished early</u>	So <u>have I</u>	They <u>haven't studied</u>	<u>Neither have I</u>
