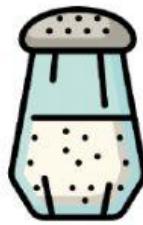

We use **How many** to ask questions about things we can count. **How many** nuts do they need?

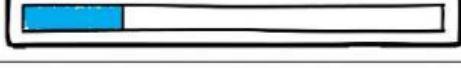
We use **How much** to ask questions about things we can't count. **How much** sugar does he need?
