




## WORKSHEET



**USE:** The superlative is used to compare one member of a group with the whole group (including the member).

**FORM:**  
 Short adjectives: the + adjective + -est  
 Long adjectives: the most + adjective

**Irregular adjectives:**  
 good - the best  
 bad - the worst  
 far - the farthest/ the furthest

**Spelling rules (relevant for short adjectives):**

**Adjectives ending in -e:**  
 add only -st  
 e.g. wide - the widest

**Adjectives ending in consonant + -y:**  
 change the y into i and add -est  
 e.g. pretty - the prettiest

**Adjectives ending in consonant, vowel, consonant (stress on the last syllable):**  
 double the final consonant and add -est  
 e.g. slim - the slimmest
