We use *all, most, many, some, no* and *none* of the with plural countable and uncountable nouns.

We use *many* with plural nouns only.

- ***all*** = every thing or person of a particular type, the whole amount

All my friends like dancing.

They've eaten ***all*** the meat.

- ***most*** = almost everyone or everything

Most birds eat insects.

Most water in this town comes from the river.

- ***many*** = a lot of people or things

There are ***many*** wild birds in this area.

- ***some*** = a number of people, things or a certain amount

Some snakes are dangerous.

Some luggage disappeared from the train.

- ***no/none*** = not any

There is ***no*** time left.

We've got ***no*** animals at home.

None of the trees is healthy.
