



PRESENT CONTINUOUS VS. PRESENT SIMPLE



Present continuous

to be (am, is, are)+verb+ing

Separate the expressions!

Do you visit your grandparents at the weekend?

I'm watching TV now.

Is he meeting his friends next week?

Susy and Henry are having breakfast.

Tom plays basketball twice a week.

Is your father working this week?

I never drink coffee.

Mum's preparing dinner.

We aren't wearing jeans today.

They often eat fast food.

Kirk always goes to school by bus.

Are you reading a book tonight?

Water freezes at 0 °C.

He doesn't do his homework right after school.

We aren't listening to music at the moment.

Do you get up early every morning?

She rarely reads magazines.

I'm still writing this English letter.

What does Henry do on Fridays?

Are they flying to Paris this month?

She's finishing ironing soon.

Dad seldom waters the plants.

Who's making that noise?

I always check my e-mails in the mornings.

We're going to the shops before lunch.

This book is good.

They aren't jogging this morning.

How often do you do sports?

It isn't raining now.
