


Section R4

Section R4 consists of 10 separate sentences which together form a continuous reading, like a story, a factual text or a description. There may be quite a variety of missing words including grammar words (such as prepositions or auxiliary verbs) or words from set phrases, idioms or phrasal verbs. There are 10 missing words worth 10 marks. You must read each sentence carefully to decide what the missing word is. It is also helpful to keep an eye on the previous sentence and the sentence after. If you spell the missing words correctly, you will get full marks. If you guess the correct word but you misspell it, you will still get half marks as the main focus of this section is reading not writing.
