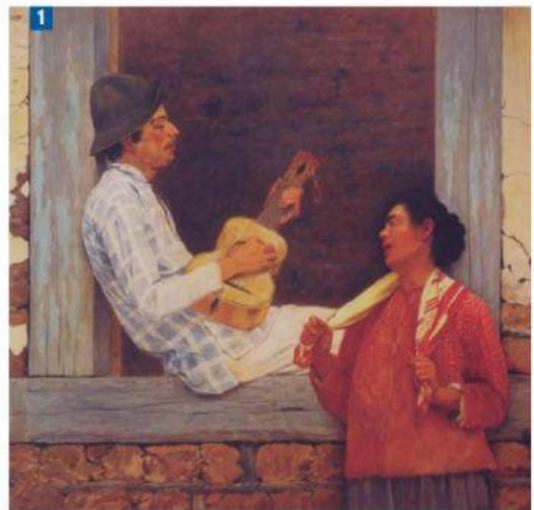

look/seem + adjective
look like + noun

<p>[əˈpiə]</p> <p>Appear is used to describe an observable condition, and it can be followed by an adjective or an infinitive:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • She appears tired. • She appears to be tired. 	<p>[ˈsi:m]</p> <p>Seem is used to show a perception by the speaker. It can be followed by an adjective or an infinitive:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • He didn't seem interested. • Their story seems to be true. <p>.....</p> <p>Seems + as if / like:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • It seems as if / like we are never going to pass this exam. 	<p>[ˈlʊk]</p> <p>Look is used to describe an observable condition, and it is followed by an adjective, not by an infinitive:</p>  <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • That cake looks delicious! <p>.....</p> <p>Looks + as if / like:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • It looks as if it's going to rain. • It looks like we're going to fail.

look / seem + adjective

The verb **look** refers to the sense of sight and is followed by an adjective. *He **looks** great for his age.* The verbs for the other senses follow the same pattern (*She **sounds** nice. It **tastes** great. It **feels** cold. That **smells** good.*)

look like + noun

This means *resemble* and is usually followed by a noun. *He **looks like** Brad Pitt.* (= He resembles Brad Pitt.)

look / seem as if / though + verb phrase

You use this to describe what something seems like. The verb in the phrase can be in any tense. *It **looks as if** it fell over. / She always **seems as though** she's going to cry.*

seem / appear + to be

These verbs help to describe your understanding of a situation. They can be followed by an adjective or noun phrase. *She **seems** sad. / He **appears to be** in trouble.*
