

SHOULD / HAVE TO / MUST = IN THE PAST

Modals in the present	Modals in the past
Should = advice You should study more.	Should have + participle = advice You should have studied more.
Must = obligation Students must wear a uniform.	Had to = obligation I had to wear a uniform when at school.
Must not = prohibition You must not smoke here.	Didn't have to = lack of necessity You didn't have to bring all your books today.
Have to = necessity I have to clean my house today.	Had to = necessity I had to clean my house yesterday.
