Letter	Genre	Description
	Fairy Tale	<b>A</b> A story in which the reader or character must use clues, to solve a problem
	Drama	<b>B</b> stories that are so fantastic that they can't possibly be true. They often have strange and unworldly settings
	Folklore	<b>C</b> humorous stories with huge exaggerations & heroes
	Historical Fiction	<b>D</b> stories used to orally pass down through generations the beliefs and customs of a community. The original author is often 'unknown'
	Realistic Fiction	<b>E</b> stories where animals, plants or objects are behaving like humans. The purpose is to teach a life lesson known as the moral
	Tall Tale	<b>F</b> stories with made-up characters and events from the past
	Mystery	<b>G</b> stories written as a dialogue between characters to be performed in a theatre
	Fantasy	<b>H</b> stories about technology, life and settings in the future or on other planets
	Mythology	<b>I</b> stories that can happen in real life but didn't happen
	Science Fiction	<b>J</b> stories about ancient culture and often include supernatural elements
	Fable	<b>K</b> stories about magical creatures with happy endings usually written for children
