Common Irregular Verbs



Usage: The simple past (also called past simple or preterite) is a [verb tense](#) which is used to show that a completed action took place at a specific time in the past. The simple past is also frequently used to talk about past habits and generalisations.

Simple Past Forms: The simple past is formed using the **verb + ed**. In addition, there are many [verbs with irregular past forms](#). Questions are made with *did* and negative forms are made with *did not*.
