possessive adjectives

Possessive adjectives tell us about who owns something or how two people are related.

Possessive adjectives come before a noun and replace **the**, **a** or **an**.

That is my **pencil**. [ownership]

Here is her **car**. [ownership]

His **sister** lives in **Sur**. [relationship]

Is **Fatma** your **sister**? [relationship]
