Elizabeth Alexandra Mary Winsor; born 21 April 1926 – or, to use her _____ title, Queen Elizabeth II – had her 86th birthday in April 2012, making her one of the _____ monarchs in British history. She has been on the _____ since her coronation on 2nd June 1953.

As you would probably expect, the Queen has had a very _____ life from most other people. As a girl she _____ music and art and enjoyed drama and swimming, but she did not go to _____ with other children – instead she had special lessons at home.

She got _____ at the age of 21 to Prince Philip, the son of Prince Andrew of Greece. They have four children: Charles, Anne, Andrew and Edward.

The Queen does not have much direct _____ with the media, and has never given an interview. However, people know some of the things she does when she is not performing her public _____ – for example she loves spending time with her corgis (a small, brown breed of dog – she has owned more than thirty of them in her _____), likes watching horse racing, and also enjoys photography.

Some interesting facts about the Queen were included in an official website _____ her 80th birthday. Among them are the following: during her _____ she has visited 129 countries and received more than 3 million _____ and emails; she has received some very unusual presents, including a jaguar from Brazil; and according to a strange law from the fourteenth century, she is the owner of any dolphin or whale swimming in the sea around Britain.

The Queen will probably stay on the throne for the rest of her life. It is likely that the next _____ will be her oldest son, Prince Charles, but it could be her grandson Prince William, who is the son of Prince Charles and the late Princess Diana.

Although some British people would like their country to be a _____ and not a monarchy, most would agree that the Queen has worked hard and tried to serve her _____ as well as she can – that is probably why she is more _____ than any prime minister in British history. She died peacefully at Balmoral Castle in Scotland on the 8th September 2022.

1. You may know that all unmarked swans on Britain waterways were technically owned by the queen, but did you know that she also owned all the dolphins and whales in British waters? They are known as "fishes royal."
2. Elizabeth met Philip when she was just eight years old and he was 13 at the wedding of Prince George (Elizabeth was brother) and Princess Marina (Philip was cousin). Elizabeth and Philip are themselves third cousins. When Philip was 18, he began writing to 13-year-old Elizabeth. Seven years later, they were engaged.
3. When she was at Balmoral, the queen was woken by a bagpiper playing under her window every morning. Apparently it goes on for a full fifteen minutes. You'd sure be ready to get up and start the day was business of queening after that!
4. In 1944, when Princess Elizabeth was 18, she joined the Auxiliary Territorial Service with which she trained as a truck driver and a mechanic in order to play her part in a war that began when she was 13 years old. She is the only female member of the British royal family to have served in the military.
5. The queen had two birthdays. She turned 96 on April 21, 2022, but her official birthday was in June. The tradition of the monarch having an "official" birthday began more than 250 years ago, with King George II deciding to publicly celebrate his birthday in the summer rather than cold and wet November. And so, since 1748, every British monarch has carried on the tradition, so that there would be less chance of poor weather impeding outdoor celebrations and military parades celebrating their birthdays.
6. The queen was the only person in the UK who is not required to have a driving license or license plate on her vehicle. She also didn't need a passport to travel, as all British passports were issued in her name.
7. You know those brightly colored outfits complete with matching hats that the queen was so fond of? Well, there was a reason that she dressed in shades of bright pink, yellow and green. It was so that she would always stand out in a crowd. She was pretty short, so wearing neon and pastel shades helped people catch a glimpse of her during public engagements.
