

Kinds of Sentences

There are four different kinds of sentences. Each serves a different purpose. A **declarative sentence** makes a statement. It ends with a period.

Jack shaded his eyes. Miami is usually warm.

An **interrogative sentence** asks a question. It ends with a question mark.

Did you pay a deposit? Where is Bolivia?

An **imperative sentence** tells someone to do something. It ends with a period.

Turn right. Please shut the window.

An **exclamatory sentence** expresses strong emotion. It ends with an exclamation mark.

What a close call you had! Call an ambulance!
