




Read the speech bubbles. Then complete the sentences with adverbs formed from the adjectives in the box.



Writing Part 2

Read the information about Writing Part 2. Choose the correct words to complete the information.

In Part 2, you have to write about (1) 80 / 100 words. You can choose between writing an article or a (2) story / report. For the article, you read information in a notice or announcement which lists (3) three or four / eight or nine things that you must write about. You (4) must / don't have to answer all these points in your message. You (5) must / don't have to explain things in your own words, so avoid just copying things from the notice or announcement.
