<p style="text-align: center; color: red;"><i>Both ...and / not only...but also / either...or / neithernor</i></p> <p>→ Correlative conjunctions work in pairs to join words, phrases, or clauses. It is also called (paired conjunction)</p>	<p style="text-align: center; color: red;"><i>And / but / or / so / yet</i></p> <p style="text-align: center;"><u>Independent Clauses</u></p> <p>An independent clause is a group of words that includes a subject and verb. It expresses a complete thought, and can stand alone as a sentence.</p>
