

## 'Can' and 'could'

As we have seen, can and could have different functions.

You CAN HAVE a break now.

You CAN'T PARK here.

CAN YOU GIVE this letter to Fay?

COULD YOU PASS me the salt, please?

I CAN DO the shopping if you like.

COULD I MAKE you a cup of tea?
