

TIME

We have many forms to say the time and it can be formal and informal.

INFORMAL FORM

It is the most common way to tell the time



What time is it? It's eight and thirty or it's eight thirty

FORMAL FORM

It uses expressions like o'clock, quarter to / past, half past, and when you read it, firstly say the minutes and then the hours.



What time is it? It's twenty-two to five.
