

 Some and Any

We can use **some** for both countable plural nouns and uncountable nouns. We use **some** when we are not sure about the quantity of something.



There are **some** apples in the basket.




I have **some** money in my pocket.

We can use **any** for both countable and uncountable nouns. **Any** is used in negative sentences and questions.

**Q:** Are there **any** eggs in the refrigerator?



**A:** Yes, there are.



**A:** No, there aren't **any**.

**Q:** Is there **any** pizza left?



**A:** Yes, there is **some** on the table.



**A:** No, there isn't **any**.
