pictures. A very popular pattern is the Union Jack (the flag of Great Britain). Today, people wear these boots in many countries around the world, but they appeared in the UK a long time ago. The Duke of Wellington asked his shoemaker in London to change his boots and make them shorter (up to the knee). This was around 1815 and that's why today they are called 'Wellies' after the Duke. Cows in India

In India we can find many endangered animals such as elephants, tigers, hippos and rhinos. There is one more animal that is very important here: the cow.

Cows are common animals in many countries around the world, but in India they are very special. They can walk freely in the streets in cities and villages. Cars and motorbikes stop for the cows to cross or take a different road when a cow is sitting in the middle of the street. Nobody can move them out of the way.

In big cities, like New Delhi, there are traffic problems because of these animals. There are about 40,000 of them in New Delhi and they make the city very dirty because they go through the rubbish in the streets. Today, there's a new job in this city: cow-catcher. These men go around New Delhi looking for cows. When they see one, they catch it and take it to the countryside. The cows are big, with big horns and they like walking in the city. So the cow-catcher's job isn't easy and it's often quite dangerous.
