THE GREAT FIRE OF LONDON.

The old city of London had narrow, crooked streets with wooden houses. It was a dirty city. In 1665 more than 75,000 people died in London from Plague. But the following year brought one more disaster: on September 2nd, 1666 a bakery in Pudding Lane near the London Bridge caught fire. After a long summer the wooden houses were dry.
