A. GRAMMAR

I. Present simple passive (Bị động thì hiện tại đơn)

- Present simple passive is used when we mention something that is done by someone regularly/ everyday/ as expected, etc.

Positive	S + am/is/are + V_{3/ed} + (by O).	Ex: The heavy boxes are carried by James.
Negative	S + am/is/are + not + V_{3/ed} + (by O).	Ex: Global warming isn't properly addressed (đề cập) in the documentary.
Question	Am/Is/Are + S + V_{3/ed} + (by O)? Wh- + am/is/are + S + V_{3/ed} + (by O)?	Ex: Is the rabbit walked by Mr. James? Where is the party held by your friend?

II. Past simple passive (Bị động thì quá khứ đơn)

- Past simple passive is used when we mention something that was done by someone at specific time in the past.

Positive	S + was/were + V_{3/ed} + (by O).	Ex: The mistakes were corrected by the teacher.
Negative	S + was/were + not + V_{3/ed} + (by O).	Ex: The wallet was not given by him.
Question	Was/Were + S + V_{3/ed} + (by O)? Wh- + was/were + S + V_{3/ed} + (by O)?	Ex: Were all the candies sold by the little boy? When was the church built?

III. Present perfect continuous (Thì hiện tại hoàn thành tiếp diễn)

- Present perfect continuous is used to talk about events or situations that started in the past and have continued up until now.

Positive	S + have/has + been + V_{ing} + O.	Ex: I have been studying at this school for 3 years.
Negative	S + have/has + not been + V_{ing} + O.	Ex: He hasn't been playing this game since last year.
Question	Have/Has + S + been V_{ing} + by O? Wh- + have/has + S + been V_{ing} + O?	Ex: Has the water been rising all night? What have you been doing here for 2 hours?

- We use present perfect continuous when:

+ The following words/ phrases appear in the sentences: **all day, all week, for long time, almost every day this week, recently, lately, in the past week, in recent years, up until now, and so far, etc.**

Ex: Anna needs a break. She **has been studying all day** (= she has just stopped).

+ The sentence has: **since + a point in time/ for + a period of time**

Ex: How long **has he been playing** basketball? - **Since** he was twelve years old.

Ex: I **have been working** here for eight years.

*Note: We don't usually use the present perfect continuous with **state verbs** like *be, have* and *know*.

Ex: We **have known** Jack for five years.

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THE ROLE OF THE MODERN ZOO

Initially seen purely as centres of entertainment, zoos were often heavily criticised in society for keeping animals captive. Nowadays, however, zoos have a lot more to offer than perhaps some people realise. Good zoos have changed their focus and are now responding to environmental problems, such as the decline in wildlife and loss of habitat. Indeed, scientists believe that a third of all animal and plant species on Earth risk extinction within this century.

The modern zoo, therefore, has developed dramatically as a major force in conserving biodiversity* worldwide. Zoos linked with the Association of Zoos and Aquariums participate in Species Survival Plan Programmes, which involve captive breeding, reintroduction programmes and public education to ensure the survival of many of the planet's threatened and endangered species.

Captive breeding is the process of breeding animals outside their natural environment in restricted conditions such as farms, zoos or other closed areas.

It is a method used to increase the populations of endangered species, in order to prevent extinction. One of the main challenges facing captive breeding programmes, however, is maintaining genetic diversity.* Zoo staff are fully trained in this area, and manage the programmes carefully to ensure genetic variation.

Another way in which zoos protect endangered species is through reintroduction programmes. These programmes release animals that have been in the zoo back into their natural habitats.

Finally, and perhaps most significantly, many zoos now concentrate on educating the public, particularly the younger generation. These zoos educate millions of visitors each year about endangered species and related conservation issues. Visiting the zoo not only raises money for conservation projects, but also reminds individuals about environmental issues.

***biodiversity** – the number and types of plants and animals that exist in a particular area, or in the world generally

***genetic diversity** – the variety of genes within a species
