Verb be: was/were

+		-	
I / He / She / It	was there.	I / He / She / It	wasn't there.
You / We / They	were there.	You / We / They	weren't there.
?		✓	✗
Was	I / he / she / it	Yes, I was.	No, I wasn't.
Were	you / we / they	Yes, you were.	No, you weren't.

We use was/were to talk about the past.

I **was** a good student.

They **were** famous artists.

Were they in class yesterday?

She **wasn't** my friend.

They **weren't** famous.
