Have you ever **ridden** a motorcycle?

Yes, I **have**. I rode one yesterday.

No, I **haven't**. But I've **ridden** a bicycle.

Has she ever **driven** a sports car?

Yes, she **has**. She drove one on vacation.

No, she's never **driven** a car.

Have you ever **been*** skydiving?

Yes, I **have**. I went last summer.

No, I **haven't**. But I've **been** parasailing.

* *been* is another past participle form of *go*
