Bonsai

Ask most people what the word 'bonsai' means and they will invariably think of a tiny Japanese tree. What the term more properly refers to is not the tree itself, but the whole system of growing shrubs or trees so that their growth is stunted.

A bonsai is a miniature replica of a full-grown tree and is kept in a container, not planted in the ground. Size may vary, though strictly (66)____, the height of the tree should not be more than twelve times the diameter of its trunk at its base. As they mature, bonsai trees and bushes are trimmed (67)____ interesting shapes, varying from cascading formations to very formal, (68)____ arrangements.

Growing bonsai trees requires skill (69)____ with a good measure of patience. The first thing to consider is whether your trees will be indoors or outdoors, (70)____ this will determine the best type of tree to cultivate. Growing bonsai from seed can be very rewarding, but purchasing pre-shaped trees of around 3-5 years old is the fastest and easiest way to get (71)_____.

There are several things to remember when caring for a bonsai. The most important rule to follow is never to allow the soil to dry out. This is more challenging with an older plant where established roots leave little space for soil in the pot (72)_____ it will therefore not retain much water. Established trees are best dealt with by totally submerging the container in water and allowing the soil to soak (73)_____ up through the drainage holes. (74)_____ the growing season, it will be necessary to trim the leaves and branches of your bonsai to create your chosen shape. This is where your creativity (75)_____ in. Exactly when to do this will depend on the variety of tree, but most species require pruning in spring and autumn.

Growing bonsai as an amateur is a hobby from which you can derive a lot of pleasure and great sense of achievement. Once you get started, you will soon find that you want to build up your bonsai collection!

Emoji and Emoticons

Emoji are small pictorial images, more properly called ideograms, which are used to replace words and symbolise reactions in digital text. They should not be confused with their predecessors, emoticons, which portray a cute (76)_____ expression using characters like punctuation marks, numbers, and letters. However, emoji and emoticons (77)_____ to achieve a similar purpose in that they can both efficiently express a person's mood while saving the writer time and energy.

Some people's messages are so peppered with emoji and emoticons that symbols and pictures (79)_____ words spelled out fully in standard text. There have even been competitions to see who could write the longest message formed of emoji and emoticons alone. This is just one of the many original ways in which emoji can bring a sense of fun to the normally mundane process of writing.
