Use any materials you desire to make it creative and interesting and informative. Someone should be able to look at it and see your plan exactly without you even being there.
- 76 – 90 2-D poster board illustration of your goal and plan of 3 things. Someone should be able to look at it and see your plan exactly without you even being there.
- 66 - 75 – 2-D hand drawn or computer-generated image of your goal and plan of 3 things on regular sized 8 ½ by 11 paper. Someone should be able to look at it and see your plan exactly without you even being there.
- 0- 65- Written report of at least 100 words detailing your goal and plan of 3 things
