

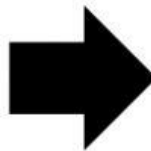
## THE FOOTBALL MATCH

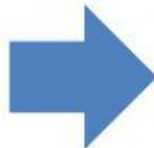

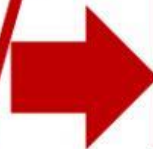
