Drew Barrymore is one of Hollywood's best paid actresses. With film successes such as ET, Scream and Charlie's Angels to her name, she is recognised wherever she goes and is a real Hollywood star. Some people complain that success has come easily to her as she is a member of a famous acting family but, in many ways, her family are the cause of more problems than help.

So who makes up the Barrymore dynasty? It all started over 100 years ago with Maurice Barrymore, Drew's great-grandfather. He married Georgina Drew, an actress. In fact, they met while acting together in a play in New York. Maurice and Georgina had three children, Drew's grandfather, John, her great aunt, Ethel and her great uncle, Lionel. Lionel is perhaps the most famous. He won an Oscar in 1931 and continued acting until his death in 1954 at the age of seventy-six. Lionel was married twice and both of his wives were also actresses.

Ethel was also a famous Hollywood star and is sometimes called "the greatest actress of her generation". She also won an Oscar, in 1944, although she wasn't particularly proud of it and it was offered for sale on eBay in 2007. Unusually for the family, she only married once although she and her husband had a difficult relationship and were divorced after fourteen rather miserable years.

Drew's grandfather, John, was slightly less successful than his siblings in his family life, although their equal as an actor. However, despite appearing in many films with a number of big stars and considered one of the greats, especially in the theatre, he never won an Oscar. In his personal life, he was married four times and had three children. He and his third wife, Dolores Costello "the goddess of the silent screen", had two children, one of whom was John Junior, Drew's father.



Unfortunately, John Junior's character stopped him from achieving success as an actor. He made a few appearances in films in the 1950s and 1960s and enjoyed the lifestyle but spent a lot of time in trouble with the police and his studio bosses. Like his father, he married four times. John Junior had four children. As each wife gave birth only once, Drew has two half-sisters and one half-brother.

Perhaps it's no surprise that she had a difficult childhood. She made her first television advert at the age of eleven months and was a star after appearing in ET when she was seven. Early success and a broken family had a bad effect on her teenage years and into her twenties. Now, though, she has grown up and become a responsible, self-confident woman. She is ambitious and, as well as acting success, she has started to direct films. In addition, she became an Ambassador Against Hunger for the United Nations in 2007 and showed her generosity by giving \$ 1 million of her own money to the cause. Only one of her siblings, her half-brother John Blyth, went into acting. He is twenty years older than Drew and he is best known for playing Zeke in the TV series Kung Fu. Now, though, he has stopped acting and works in software development.

So, it is Drew who is keeping the family tradition alive and she seems to be doing a very good job of it. The only question remaining is whether there will one day be another generation of Barrymores in Hollywood. Drew has been married twice but is not, yet, a mother.
